Unit 2: The world and Russia in ancient times and the Middle Ages (1 lecture, 1 seminar) The territory of Russia in the Ancient World. Middle Ages as the stage of

history in Western Europe, in the East and in Russia. The Old Russian State: features social and political development.

Unit 3: Russia in the  $16^{\text{th}} - 17^{\text{th}}$  centuries in the context of European civilization (1 lecture, 1 seminar) The  $16^{\text{th}}$  and  $17^{\text{th}}$  centuries in world history. Ivan the Terrible: the search for alternative ways of socio-political development of Russia. Socio-economic and political processes in the Moscow State in the  $17^{\text{th}}$  century.

Unit 4: Russia and the World in the 18<sup>th</sup> -19<sup>th</sup> centuries (2 lectures, 2 seminars) The 18<sup>th</sup> and 19<sup>th</sup> centuries in European and World history. Speeding up the process of industrialization in the 19th century and its political, economic, social and cultural consequences. Modernization in Russia in the 18<sup>th</sup> and 19<sup>th</sup> centuries.
