

# LEADERSHIP, ETHICS & SUSTAINABILITY for International Students at DHBW Heidenheim

## **COURSE OUTLINE**

- Culture-based Leadership Style: Leadership by Nature
- Basics of Ethics & Basics of Sustainability
- Ethical Points of View: international perspectives
- Ethics and Sustainability: an international comparison.

The course content combines a historical approach to Ethics in Business, Leadership by Nature and an introduction to Sustainability Development Goals. Students will combine those three aspects in draft sustainability concept for their universities.

## **GOALS**

- Understanding of the dimensions of ethics and sustainability on leadership.
- Understanding of different approaches and strategies to implement ethics in the context of business, research and society as a whole.
- A better understanding of intercultural diversity in these contexts.
- Ability to reflect own values and those of others resulting in the ability to constructively work in international teams.

## **MARKING**

Students will each submit a portfolio of the following:

# Individual marking (50%):

**EITHER:** Instagram rallye. Students will need an instagram account; if they don't have one, they can set one up for the course. Minimum requirements are **2 postings each** week from **25 January 2021 until 17 February 2021**.

OR: 5 minute Stand-up; Leadership, Ethics & Sustainability in the News

The Stand-up will be marked based on reflections.

The **Stand-up** presents students' reflections of current news, taking into consideration leadership, ethics and sustainability. Contributions should be new ideas.

The instagram rallye mark is based on how much **posts combine a mix of own contributions and retweeting or sharing** of **relevant other posts** and how **creative** the tool is used.

## **Team work (50%):**

Sustainability concept for the universities: teams need members from at least 2 different countries; concept needs to **identify areas of action and best practices** and needs to **outline a high-level process** for implementation.

The concept is marked based on **sound reflection of selected SDG**s, how convincing the **implementation process** is presented and if the team identified **existing best practices**. Student teams will analyse similarities and differences in their university set-ups and accordingly suggest applicable strategies for their respective home universities. Max. 3000 words, excl. literature, plus cc-licenced presentation material.

For all tasks students need to **follow <u>cc-licencing</u> procedure** and make sure they are only using legally sound sources (no copyrighted content!).

**Students register** their **instagram account** or their **topic for a 5 minutes stand-up** in the **list** provided on Google drive by 25 January 2021, end of day.

# **Participants Selection Process**

Partner universities announce course to their students and nominate a total of 10 suitable candidates by 10 December 2020.

Nominated students fulfil minimum requirements:

- Good academic standing (GPA)
- Minimum 3rd semester
- No overlapping lectures at home university
- Students in a program relating to those subjects (business, technology, environmental studies, etc)

Nominations need to include information on above criteria for each student; partner uni sends an excel list via email to **ilg@dhbw-heidenheim.de**.

DHBW Heidenheim selects from those nominations a total of 24-30 international students.

DHBW Heidenheim confirms successful students via email to International Offices by 17 December 2020.

#### **AUDIENCE**

International students from approx. 8 DHBW partner universities (max. 24 students); DHBW students optional (max. 6 students); total maximum 30

All students need to at least attend 3rd semester studies. Students need to attend all online sessions and need to be able to do self-study and project work, according to 3 ECTS.

International students get marked and 3 ECTS; DHBW students get certificate of attendance
