











Eastern Rattlesnake



THE NORTH ATLANTIC RIGHT WHALE






After almost 1000 years of whaling that brought the species close to extinction in the early 20th century.






The Vancouver Marmot is endangered because their habitat is being destroyed by the development of sky slopes.






SEA OTTER





The trumpeter swan was once a common nesting bird in the north, west and central part of America.


Now: Trumpeter swan presently number about 5000, they almost have been removed from the list of endangered species.

Vital Signs

Common name: Eastern cougar Status under SARA: Data Deficient. In 1978, the eastern subspecies was declared "endangered" by the Committee on the Status of Endangered Wildlife in Canada. The status was re-examined in 1998, and the animal was designated "data deficient" because there was not enough data to evaluate the status of the animal or its classification as a subspecies.

Range: Ontario, Quebec, New




