During the 1990s I worked on a variety of EAP programmes at the University of Hertfordshire and more recently spent a number of years at Cambridge Exams where I worked on the Business English Certificates and the Oxford EFL Exam. Co-author of TPU professional enhancement course "Writing for Publication".

Kate is a linguist who spent ten years teaching English to international students across the globe and in universities around the UK, before training in the effective use of technology in language teaching. She is an experienced developer of online learning materials and an e-tutor and currently coordinates LLAS activity in relation to elearning, initiating and managing projects, devising and delivering training, and organising and running events.

More than 10 years Larisa Germanovna Smyshlyaeva has been researching effective approaches to education of adults, i.e. education during the life. Scientific area of professional interests of Larisa Germanovna is the theory and technique of professional education. The main results of scientific researches, that are reflected in author's scientific publications, educational and methodical works and the current educational programs, are made in the field of andragogy and acmeology. The author published a series of works devoted to the questions of enrichment of Russian andragogic practice with the experience of application of technologies of the competence-based education.

The partial list of the scientific and methodical interests of Elena Borisovna includes effective teaching of the professionally-focused foreign language in the frames of modern higher education; the questions of internationalization of English in educational and professional contexts; formation of the competence-based model by students which combines mobile and consumerist English and maintenance of active functional plurilingualism at the individual level.
